

Introduction

The HEOS Bar is part of the HEOS wireless multi-room sound system that enables you to enjoy your favorite music anywhere and everywhere around your home. By utilizing your existing home network and the HEOS app on your iOS or Android™ device, you can explore, browse, and play music from your own music library or from many online streaming music services.

- True multi-room audio play different songs in different rooms or the same song in every room
- · Utilizes your existing home wireless network for quick and easy setup
- Industry leading microsecond audio synchronization between HEOS device
- Legendary Denon audio quality
- If you are in a hurry, you can be enjoying great sounding music in no time by following the steps outlined in the HEOS Quick Start Guide (packaged with your HEOS device).

System requirements

Before you begin installing your first HEOS device, please make sure you understand and meet a few basic requirements.

Network requirements

Wireless Router - In order to use your HEOS music system, you must have a working wireless (Wi-Fi) or ethernet network in your home. Even when connected to an Ethernet network, a Wi-Fi connection to the router is required to control the system using the HEOS Control app. If you do not have a wireless network, please contact your local Denon dealer or electronics retailer to assist you with purchasing and installing a wireless network in your home.

High Speed Internet Connection - HEOS accesses the Internet to stream music to your home from many popular online music services. HEOS is also designed to provide you with software updates, which are delivered via your home Internet connection. DSL, Cable, and Fiber services will provide the best experience and reliability. You may experience performance issues with slower Internet connections like satellite based services.



■ Controller requirements

You can control your HEOS wireless multi-room sound system using the free HEOS app on any iOS or Android mobile device that meets these minimum requirements:



iOS Minimum Requirements

- iOS version 8.0 or later
- iPhone® 4S or newer
- iPad® 2 or newer
- iPod touch® (5th generation) or newer

- · Android OS version 4.0 or later
- All resolutions






- ↑ Volume up/down buttons (+, -)

- 2 Threaded mounting hole (for wall mount)
 Used to mount this unit on a wall or ceiling.
- 3 Status LED (for wall mount)



IR repeater

Remote control signals received by the HEOS Bar are re-sent from the rear of the HEOS Bar. (127 p. 18)





2 AC inlet (AC IN)

Used to connect the power cord. (p. 22)

- (3) HDMI connectors (HDMI IN)
 Used to connect to the HDMI equipment with an HDMI cable.
 (127 p. 30)
- ① HDMI connector to TV (HDMI OUT) Used to connect to the TV with an HDMI cable. (Compatible with the ARC function) (№ p. 26)
- (§) REMOTE CONTROL jack (IR IN)

 Used to connect infrared receivers/transmitters in order to operate this unit and external devices from a different room. (反 p. 31)
- Oigital audio connectors (DIGITAL IN) Used to connect devices equipped with digital audio outputs. (Pp. p. 30)

AUX jack (AUX IN)


Used to connect audio devices with a 1/8 inch (3.5 mm) cable. (译字 p. 30)

Used to add the HEOS device to your wireless network. ($\ensuremath{\mathfrak{P}}$ p. 24)

- (1) USB port
 Used to connect USB storage devices. (12 p. 31)
- **① NETWORK connector**Used to connect this unit to a wired Ethernet network. (反音 p. 24)
- CONNECT button Used for Wi-Fi setup.
- Connect in status LED Indicates the status of this unit. (₱ p. 69)



■ Remote control unit



Mute button (◀X)

This mutes the output audio.

Quick Select buttons (1 – 6)

These call up settings registered to each button, such as input source, volume level and sound mode settings. (** p. 44)

3 Volume up/down buttons (+, -)

These adjusts the volume level.

4 Power button (也)

This toggles the power mode of this unit.

System buttons

These perform playback related operations.

- Reverse-skip / Forward-skip buttons (I◄◄, ▶►I)
- Play/pause button (►/II)



Placing your HEOS Bar

The HEOS Bar is designed to enhance the sound of your TV and allow you to enjoy HEOS Wireless Multi-Room Sound. Place the HEOS Bar at a convenient location near the TV.

• The HEOS Bar must be within range of your wireless network.


Tabletop

The HEOS Bar should be place as close as possible to the TV screen. It should be centered left-to-right with the screen, and ideally no more than a few inches above or below. The most common location is below the screen. Sometimes this location can be difficult, because the base of the TV gets in the way. The HEOS Bar has set of feet that raise the HEOS Bar, for a more stable and attractive installation when used with this type of TV.



■ How to attach the feet

Attach the supplied feet if you need to raise the HEOS Bar over your TV stand base.

■ IR repeater

Depending on your TV model or installation location, the remote control receiver on the TV may be hidden by the HEOS Bar, preventing the remote control from being used because the remote control signals cannot reach the TV.

Remote control signal HEOS Bar has been received, will be re-sent from the back of the HEOS Bar.





Wall-Mounting

The HEOS Bar can be wall-mounted using the integrated keyhole mounts. A mounting template can be found in the product carton. Using a level, position and tape the template to the wall in the desired location. Install hardware* using the template as a guide and then remove the mounting template from the wall. Connect the audio and power cables prior to mounting the HEOS Bar on the wall.

* Consult a person knowledgeable about your wall type to recommend suitable hardware for hanging the speaker.



NOTE

- To ensure safety, request a contractor perform the mounting work when mounting onto a wall.
- In order to use the unit safely, do not place items on or hang items from the unit.
- Be sure to fix connection cables to the wall to ensure that cannot be pulled or tripped over causing the unit to fall. Check that the unit is mounted safely after the mounting work is complete. Recommend installing a safety wire (not included) at the safety wiring hole on the bottom of the HEOS Bar in order to prevent injury to the user and others or damage to property should the HEOS Bar fall for some reason.
- Also, periodically check the safety of the unit and whether there is a possibility that the unit may fall.
- Denon cannot accept any responsibility for damage, injury or accidents caused by problems with the mounting location or mounting method.




Before using the remote control unit

The remote control unit has a built-in lithium battery. Pull out the insulation sheet before use.




Replacing the battery

- Pull the groove on the left side of the battery case at the bottom of the reverse side of the remote control unit to the right.
- 2. In this state, pull the battery case downwards.



- 3. Insert the lithium battery (CR2025) correctly into the battery compartment as indicated.
- 4. Replace the battery case in the original position.



NOTE


- When inserting the lithium battery, be sure to do so in the proper direction, following the ⊕ and ⊖ marks in the battery compartment.
- If the battery should have a leakage, immediately replace and dispose of the battery. In this case, there is a risk of burn when the liquid comes in contact with skins or clothes, so a great care should be taken. If the liquid accidentally comes in contact, wash with tap water and consult a doctor.
- Remove the battery from the remote control unit if it will not be in use for long periods.







Getting the HEOS app

The HEOS app is the heart of the HEOS experience. Using your mobile device and the HEOS app, you can setup, browse, explore, and control your HEOS system right in the palm of your hand, from anywhere in your home.

Download the HEOS app for iOS or Android by searching App Store[®], Google Play[™] store or Amazon for "HEOS".

Setting up your first HEOS Bar

Once you have placed your HEOS Bar in your listening room and have downloaded the HEOS app, you are ready to configure your HEOS Bar for music playback. This involves following a few simple steps to get the HEOS Bar connected to your existing home network:

Caution

- DO NOT connect the Ethernet cable if you are connecting your HEOS Bar to a wireless network. If you are connecting the HEOS Bar to a wired network, use an Ethernet cable to connect the HEOS Bar to your network or router.
- Make sure your mobile device is connected to your wireless network (the same network you want your HEOS Bar connected to).

You can check this in the Settings - Wi-Fi menu of your iOS or Android device.

NOTE

- If your wireless network is secure, make sure you know the password to join your network.
- 2 Make sure you have the included 1/8 inch (3.5 mm) setup cable handy.



3 Launch the HEOS app on your mobile device.



- 4 Tap the "Setup Now" button at the top of the screen.
- Follow the instructions to add the HEOS Bar to your wireless network.

The Wi-Fi settings from your mobile device will be copied to the HEOS Bar via the audio cable.

 If you have any problems connecting your HEOS device, jump to the Troubleshooting section. (Pp. 63)



Adding more HEOS devices

The HEOS wireless multi-room sound system is a true multiroom audio system that automatically synchronizes audio playback between multiple HEOS devices so that the audio coming from different rooms is perfectly in sync and always sounds amazing! You can easily add up to 32 devices to your HEOS system.

Adding wired HEOS devices

Just connect the HEOS devices to your home network using an Ethernet cable and the HEOS devices will appear on your HEOS app as a new room in the "Rooms" screen.

At your convenience, you can assign a name to the HEOS devices to indicate which room you have it placed in.




- Use only a shielded STP or ScTP LAN cable which is easily available at electronics stores (CAT-5 or greater recommended).
- Do not connect a Network Connector directly to the LAN port/Ethernet connector on your computer.

Adding wireless HEOS devices

You can add additional wireless HEOS devices to your HEOS system by selecting "Add Device" from the HEOS app's settings menu and follow the instructions:







Connecting devices

When you run HEOS bar for the first time, "Setup Assistant" will be started automatically to guide you setup connections.

You can start "Setup Assistant" anytime from setup menu, when you want to change the configurations. "Changing the TV connection" (127 p. 57)

Connecting to your TV

■ HDMI connection

You can enjoy high quality audio and video playback by connecting this unit and a TV or this unit and a device such as a Blu-ray Disc recorder or game console using a HDMI cable to transmit high resolution digital video signals and Blu-ray Disc audio signals.

- ARC (Audio Return Channel) function
 The TV audio can be played back through this unit using the HDMI cable used to connect this unit to the TV (*).
- * The TV also needs to be compatible with the ARC function.

■ Setting the HDMI control function

(See the TV Owner's Manual for details.)

Enable the HDMI control function on the TV.


If the TV is compatible with the ARC function, enable the ARC function on the TV.

■ Disable your television's speakers

Disable your television's built-in speakers when using HEOS Bar. Usually, this is done with an on-screen setup menu on your television. Look for an "Audio" or "Sound" sub-menu, and a "Speakers Off", "Disable Speakers", "External Speakers" or similar menu item. Some televisions have a switch on the rear panel to disable the built-in speakers.


■ Playing HDMI (ARC) - Best choice

If your TV has an ARC (Audio Return Channel) HDMI connector, connect it to the HDMI output of the HEOS Bar. This will provide the best sound and several other benefits.

- 1 Connect your TV with an ARC (Audio Return Channel) HDMI connector to the HDMI OUT (ARC) connector on your HEOS Bar using the included HDMI cable.
- 2 Select "TV" from the music tab.
- 3 Select the name of the HEOS Bar to which you connected the TV in step 1.
- The sound from your TV can be played directly on the HEOS Bar.

NOTE

- The TV also needs to be compatible with the ARC function.
 Turn the TV HDMI control function on. See the TV Owner's Manual for details.






■ Playing HDMI (without ARC) - Better choice

Connect to a TV that is not compatible with the ARC (Audio Return Channel) function using the HDMI cable and audio input cable.

- 1 Connect your TV with an HDMI connector to HDMI OUT (ARC) connector on your HEOS Bar using the included HDMI cable.
- Connect your TV to your HEOS Bar using either an included optical cable or a coaxial cable (not included).
- Select "TV" from the music tab.
- 4 Select the name of the HEOS Bar to which you connected the TV in step 1 and 2.
- The sound from your TV can be played directly on the HEOS Bar.

NOTE

- The TV audio cannot be played back on this unit when it is only connected with the HDMI cable.






Connectiong an other devices


■ Connecting to your HDMI equipment

You can play back from a device that has a HDMI terminal, such as a Bluray disc recorder or game console.



■ Connecting an audio playback device

Connect the COAXIAL IN, OPTICAL IN or AUX IN input to an audio playback device (CD player, portable music player, etc...) using the appropriate cables.




■ Connecting a USB storage device

Connect a FAT32 formatted USB storage device containing digital music files to any available USB port.



■ IR repeater

It can still be controlled by the remote control by connecting a remote control receiver unit (sold separately).


Pairing a HEOS Subwoofer and Surrounds


HEOS Bar can be used as a multi-channel system by pairing with HEOS speakers or a HEOS Subwoofer.

- 1 Select the Settings icon located in the upper left corner of the main "Music" menu to display the Settings menu.
- 2 Select "HEOS Bar" from "My Devices".
- 3 Launch Setup Assistant.
 Setup assistant guides the HEOS Bar to pair

NOTE


 A HEOS Subwoofer and surround speakers need to connect your wireless network before pairing.

■ Pairing the HEOS Subwoofer

- 1 Select "Subwoofer".
- **9** Select "HEOS Subwoofer", then tap NEXT.

NOTE


- Configure the HEOS Subwoofer settings after pairing is complete. Select "Optimized for HEOS Bar" for normal configuration. Settings are optimized for the HEOS Bar.
- Adding surround speakers
- 1 Select "Surrounds".
- 2 Select "Wireless HEOS Speakers" or "HEOS Amp" and tap NEXT.

Select the device that you want to add and tap NEXT.



■ Unpairing HEOS Subwoofer and Surrounds

- 1 Tap the pencil icon in the upper right from the "Rooms" menu.
- 2 Select "HEOS Bar".
- 3 Select the device that you want to disconnect from the list.





Using your HEOS Bar

Once you have your HEOS device connected to your network and the HEOS app installed on your mobile device, it's easy to start enjoying your favorite music. You can listen to something different in every room or the same music perfectly synchronized in all rooms. It's up to you!

HEOS account

■ What is a HEOS account?

A HEOS account is master account or "keychain" for managing all of your HEOS music services with one single username and password.

■ Why do I need a HEOS account?

With the HEOS account you just have to enter your music services login names and passwords one time. This allows you to easily and quickly use multiple controller apps on different devices. You just log into your HEOS account on any device and you will have access to all of your associated music services, play history and custom playlists, even if you are at a friend's house listening to music on their HEOS system.

■ Signing up for a HEOS account

You will be instructed to signup for a HEOS account the first time you try to access any music service from the main "Music" menu of the HEOS app.

Selecting a room/device

1 Tap the "Rooms" tab, and select HEOS Bar if there are multiple HEOS devices.



• Tap the pencil icon at the top right to switch edit mode. You can change the displayed name.





Listening to the same music in multiple rooms

The HEOS system is a true multiroom audio system that automatically synchronizes audio playback between multiple HEOS devices so that the audio coming from different rooms is perfectly in sync and always sounds amazing!

You can easily add up to 32 HEOS devices to your HEOS system. You can join or group up to 16 individual HEOS devices into a group of HEOS devices that function as if they were a single HEOS device.

■ Grouping rooms

- Press and hold your finger on room that is not playing music.
- Drag it into the room that is playing music (indicated by the red outline) and lift your finger.

The two rooms will be grouped together into a single device group and both rooms will be playing the same music in perfect sync.



- When audio from the device connected to this unit is played back in a group, only 2-channel PCM input from the HDMI, digital or analog terminals can be played back.
- Grouping cannot be used when this unit is playing TV audio or external input audio. Enable "TV Sound Grouping" to use grouping. (☼ p. 57)





■ Ungrouping rooms

- 1 Press and hold your finger on room that you want to remove from the group.
- 2 Drag it out of the group and lift your finger.
 Music will stop playing in the room you dragged out of the group but

will continue playing in any remaining rooms.

NOTE

• You can not remove the first room that started playing the music before grouping.





■ Grouping all rooms (party mode)

You can easily group 16 rooms together into Party Mode by using a "pinch" gesture.

- 1 Place two fingers on the screen over the list of rooms.
- **Q** Quickly pinch your two fingers together and release.

All of your rooms will be joined together and begin playing the same music in perfect sync.





■ Ungrouping all rooms

You can easily ungroup all of your rooms and exit Party Mode by using a "spread" gesture.

- 1 Place two fingers close together on the screen over list of rooms.
- Quickly spread your two fingers apart from each other and release.

All of your rooms will be ungrouped.





Selecting the music track or station from music sources

1 Tap the "Music" tab and select a music source.





• All music services displayed may not be available in your location.



2 Browse the music to play.

After selecting a music track or radio station the app will automatically change to the "Now Playing" screen.



 When you select a music track to play you will be asked how you want to queue up your music.

Play Now:	Inserts the item into the queue after the currently playing track and plays the selected item immediately.
Play Now & Replace Queue:	Clears the queue and plays the selected item immediately.
Play Next:	Inserts the item into the queue after the current song and plays it when the current song ends.
Add to End of Queue:	Adds the item to the end of the queue.



 \bullet When you select a radio station the following items are displayed.

Play Now:	Plays the selected item immediately.
Add to HEOS Favorites:	Adds to HEOS Favorites.







Rearranging the now playing queue

Once you have songs lined up in your queue, you might want to rearrange the order or remove some songs:

- **1** Tap the "Now Playing" tab.
- 2 Tap the Queue licon in the upper right corner of the screen.
- 3 Tap the Pencil **I** icon to enter Edit mode.
- Rearrange the order of your queue by dragging the list icon (on the right side of each track row) up or down.

Deleting songs from the play queue

You can remove songs one at a time from the Now Playing Queue:

- 1 Tap the "Now Playing" tab.
- 2 Tap the Queue icon in the upper right corner of the screen.
- 3 Tap the Pencil **□** icon to enter Edit mode.
- 4 Tap the track(s) that you want to delete.
- Tap the Delete icon to delete all of the selected tracks from the play queue.



Deleting all songs from the play queue

You can remove all of the songs from the Now Playing Queue:

- 1 Tap the "Now Playing" tab.
- 2 Tap the Queue icon in the upper right corner of the screen.
- 3 Tap the Delete icon to confirm that you want to delete all songs from the queue.

Saving playlists

You can save the Now Playing Queue as a HEOS Playlist that you can recall later. The new playlist will be available from the Playlists button on the "Music" tab on every controller app connected to your HEOS system.

- 1 Tap the "Now Playing" tab.
- 2 Tap the Queue icon in the upper right corner of the screen.
- 3 Tap on the Save ☆ icon.
- 4 Enter a name for your Playlist and tap the Save 🛣 icon.



Quick Select function

Input source, volume level and surround mode settings can be registered to the Quick select buttons (1 - 6).

1 To register the current setting, point the remote control unit at this unit and then press and hold the Quick Select button you want to register (1-6) for 3 seconds.



- The status LED on the main unit flashes once when registration is complete.
- You can also register using the HEOS app.
